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Roles of Public Libraries for Socio Economic Developments with Special Reference to Periyar E.V.R. District Central Library of Vellore

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Abstract:

The contribution of public libraries for social and economic developments of the society are much appreciated. Their roles are to be recoganised by the society as they are known as temple of learning and part and parcel of the social system. This study is focussing on these roles played by the Periyar E.V.R district central library of Vellore. The results of the study indicate that the information dissemination of the library towards the social and economic developments are much opined by the library users as well as the study concludes that the digital resources on competitive examinations are need to be brought to the library.

1. Introduction

The public libraries are aptly called as 'common man university' and the institutions that are preserving and promoting historical, and cultural values of human beings. And as per Audit Commission report (Audit Commission, 1997), of UK, the public libraries have the following responsibilities and duties which are summarised and presented hereunder:

- Recreational and cultural roles
- Promoting self learning among the readers who are pursuing informal education
- Promoting social welfare, social rights and responsibilities
- Economic development by the ways disseminating the information on employment and entrepreneurship.

The common man university 'public library' is contributing much to the socio economic development of a country by providing access to various information almost at free of cost in India. Nevertheless to say that they are the backbone in disseminating information to at the gross root level of the society. For instance, a poor educated youth may seek employment opportunities in the public library since he may not be able to buy or subscribe the required publication for this purpose. Simultaneously, lot of information products like news papers, magazines and periodicals on agriculture, small scale industries are acquired or subscribed by the public libraries which may highly useful for the farmers and small entrepreneurs of the rural environment. No doubt, certainly the public libraries are the information centres that are contributing for the socio economic developments for the rural communities as well as urban elites.

2. Need for the Study

The Public libraries are driving force for the socio-economic and cultural development of the country. In this context, this study made an attempt to study the contribution of the Periyar E.V.R District central Library of Vellore for the socio-economic development of the community for which it serves from the point view of the users of the library so as to suggest to improve the working nature of the library for better performance.

3. Profiles of the Library

Vellore District has a total of 67 branch libraries, 69 village libraries and 42 part-time libraries. One district central library, named after the great rationalist E.V.R who is an instrumental in Dravidian movement in the country as Thanthai Periyar E.V.R. District Central Library was opened on 22nd November 1959, in Infantry Road, Vellore. The library consists of following sections

- Reference Section
- Periodical Section
- Women and Children Section

- Book lending Section
- Reprographic Section
- New book collection and distribution section
- Computer Section
- Civil Service and Competitive Examination
- Browsing Section
- Binding Section

The timings of the library is 8.am to 8 p.m and it has a collection of more than 1.57 lakh books and 26,622 registered members and 286 patrons. The collection consists of Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, Hindu and English books across different subjects and subscribe to 186 periodicals and 18 newspapers. It has a excellent facilities in its differently abled section for persons with disabilities along with five to six wheelchairs. It also has very good collections for competitive and for civil services aspirants. At present, reference books at a cost of Rs. 64 lakh were added to this section. Television, DVD facility and computers are also available and a separate section for children with internet facility along with Braille books for visual impaired.

4. Objectives of the Study

The following objectives are framed for the purpose of the study

- To study the user visit the library to seek agriculture related issues
- To study the information dissemination of the library from the point of view of the user on social welfare, social rights and political issues
- To study its roles for Economic development by the ways of disseminating the information on employment and entrepreneurship and creating awareness on General Knowledge to its user.

5. Methodology

Judgement sampling technique has been employed to select a sample of hundred respondents from the user group of the library. A well structured questionnaire has been administered among the respondents of 100. Thus, the collected data has been analysed and interpreted as follows:

It is seen from the table no -1 that majority of the respondents that is 46 percent fall in the age group of 15 to 30. And a minimum of 1 percent of respondents belongs to 60 to 70 age group. The data related to category of respondents have been presented in the table no. 3 It is seen from the table that a majority of the respondents of the survey belongs to the academic community students and teachers. to teachers and businessman in equal percentage of 20 and labour was the lowest percentage of 8 participated. Altogether, they survey covers different kind of users those who are visiting the library for their day to day information needs.

Agriculture is the backbone of the Indian economy, the library under study is disseminating agricultural related information to its user in the farm of magazine, newspapers, central and state government publications, publications of financial and other institutions that are related to agricultural developments. An enquiry has been made through the questionnaire of the study. The resulted data has been presented in the table no - 5. It is seen from the table that minimum percent of the respondents are visiting the library to seek information related to agricultural issues as presented in the table. However, it can be said that minimum no. of the farmers participated in the survey that is the reason less percent of respondents opined these aspects, but it is proved in the results that all the farmers who are visiting the library for seeking agricultural developments related issues and information.

The Table 6 shows that the majority of the respondents i.e. 92 percent visit the library to get the information on govt. employment opportunities followed by the employment opportunities in private sector i.e. 76 percent. The reader visiting the library for getting information on overseas employment opportunities are minimum in percent . 54 percent of respondents stated that they visit the library to seek information on self employment, the same percent of the respondents are also opined that they visiting the library for getting information on entrepreneur loans.
